Tribe to Play at UNC Wilmington in Televised Game

William and Mary's men's basketball team will head south to face Colonial Athletic Association rival UNC Wilmington Saturday at 4:00 PM ... The game between the two teams will be televised live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Philadelphia and Detroit, as well as on FoxSportsNet South in North Carolina ... The Tribe will enter the game attempting to put a stop to a three-game losing streak, including Thursday's 57-46 defeat against first-place Drexel ... UNCW, currently tied for second in the CAA with three other teams, won at Delaware, 71-58, on Thursday night.

Storylines

Saturday's game will be the 47th in the series between W&M and UNC Wilmington ... The Seahawks have won their last four meetings with the Tribe, and nine of the last 10 ... UNCW is 15-7 all-time against W&M in Wilmington ... Earlier this season, the Seahawks defeated the Tribe, 75-66, in Williamsburg on Nov. 30 ... The Tribe's last win over the Seahawks in Wilmington was a 77-70 victory on Feb. 12, 1994 ... Since then, the Green and Gold has lost 11 times in Trask Coliseum ... The two teams have met at least twice a year starting with the 1983-84 season ... The series began with a 61-55 UNCW win in Williamsburg on Jan. 4, 1984.

W&M fell to Drexel, the only remaining undefeated team in CAA play, 57-46, in Williamsburg on Thursday ... The Dragons jumped out to a 16-2 lead early and led 34-24 in the second half, before the Tribe used a 13-0 run to pull ahead, 34-33 ... However, the Dragons ran off 14 unanswered points of their own on the way to the win ... Senior center **Brian Hutt** picked up his first career double-double, leading the Tribe with 12 points (on 6-7 shooting) and 10 rebounds ... Junior forward **Laimis Kisielius** also scored in double figures with 11 points for W&M.

Freshman guard **Calvin Baker** was named the CAA Rookie of the Week for the third time on Dec. 27, and is the only player to win the award more than once this season ... He leads the Tribe in scoring with 13.8 ppg and, through Jan. 4, was the league's top scoring rookie and seventh overall in the CAA.

Baker Named CAA Rookie of the Week for Third Time

Freshman guard **Calvin Baker** was named the CAA's Rookie of the Week for the third time this season on Dec. 27, after also earning the award on Nov. 21 and Nov. 28 ... He earned the honor after scoring 19 points (including 16 in the second half) also adding four rebounds, three assists and three steals in W&M's win over UNC Greensboro (12/21) ... Baker leads the Tribe in scoring with 13.8 ppg and, through Jan. 4, was seventh in the league (and first among CAA freshmen) with 14.3 ppg ... Baker also leads W&M with 3.1 assists per game ... He has scored in double figures eight times this season, including five games of more than 15 points ... Baker was voted to the W&M Tip-Off Classic all-tournament team to start the season ... At Woodside (Newport News, VA) High School, he was named the Virginia Group AAA Player of the Year by the Virginia HS Coaches Association and was picked as the state's co-player of the year by the Associated Press ... A two-time *Daily Press* Player of the Year, he led Woodside to state championships in 2004 and 2005 and was the MVP of the state's East-West All-Star game in July of 2005.

Cofield Starting Strong Again

Junior forward **Corey Cofield** appears to

be picking up where he left off last season as one of the top players in the CAA ... The Tribe's leading scorer (13.2 ppg) and rebounder (6.9 rpg) last season, Cofield is second on the team with 10.3 ppg and leads the team with 5.2 rpg ... For the second straight game, Cofield came off the bench for 14 points and six rebounds at Virginia Tech (12/27) ... Through Jan. 4, he ranked third in the CAA with a .583 field goal percentage (currently .538) and ranks seventh all-time at W&M in that category with a .522 mark in his career ... The 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, Cofield just missed his 12th career double-double in the season opener vs. Maine (11/19), with 19 points and nine rebounds in just 23 minutes.

Hutt Doing the Dirty Work

Although scoring just 4.8 points per game, senior **Brian Hutt** has been a valuable force inside, averaging 5.0 rebounds and a team-high 0.8 blocks, despite playing 17.7 minutes per game ... Thursday against Drexel, he recorded his first career double-double (and W&M's first of the season), with team highs of 12 points (on 6-7 shooting) and 10 rebounds in 28 minutes ... In the Tribe's win over UNC Greensboro (12/21), the 6-9 center pulled down a game and career-high 11 rebounds, adding five points,

two assists and a blocked shot ... In the game before that (at UMBC, 12/17) he had eight rebounds, six points, four assists and a block ... Connecting on 22 of his 36 field goal attempts (.611), he also has 12 assists against just eight turnovers.

Better off the Bench?

Junior forward **Corey Cofield**, W&M's second leading scorer (10.3 ppg) and top rebounder (5.2 rpg) has come off the bench in six of 12 games, including each of the last three ... His numbers are actually better across the board when he comes off the bench, averaging 4.0 more points and 2.0 more rebounds ... Three of his top four scoring games, and five of his top six rebounding games have been ones in which he came off the bench ... Last season, Cofield led the team in points (13.2 ppg) and rebounds (6.9 rpg), while starting 27 of the 29 games ... For his career, Cofield has played in 69 games with 54 starts.

Alums Adam Hess and Jim Moran Nominated for FIBA Eurocup All-Star Game

Former Tribe basketball players **Adam Hess** (2004) and **Jim Moran** (2001) have each been nominated for selection to the FIBA EuroCup All-Star Game ... In EuroCup play, which involves the top professional teams throughout Europe, Hess is averaging 15.3 ppg and a team-best 8.4 rpg for Nymburk of the Czech Republic, while Moran is averaging a team-best 12.2 ppg for Gran Canaria of Spain ... In league play, Hess is fifth in the Czech Republic's NBL with 18.8 ppg and his team has a 12-0 record ... Individuals can vote online for the all-star team once per day through Feb. 3 by going to fibaeurope.com, then clicking on the "EuroCup" link on the left and then clicking on the "All-Star Day" link in the table on the left of the following page ... When the new MTV show "Call 2 Greatness" visited the W&M campus this fall, senior **Hawley Smith** was selected from the crowd of students to attempt to set a world record in "pudding plonking," which involves hurling blood pudding from a frying pan ... According to MTV, Smith set an American record by launching the food to a distance of 117 feet, a mere 18 inches short of breaking the world record ... The episode is scheduled to be broadcast on Feb. 12.

W&M Opens CAA Play Early

W&M's conference opener against UNC Wilmington (11/30) was the Tribe's earliest game against a CAA opponent in school history ... It was the second CAA game of

the season, after Georgia State defeated Delaware, 99-72, in the CAA's first game on Nov. 22 ... W&M is 8-13 all-time in CAA openers ... Before this season, the Tribe had won the last five times it played its first conference game at home, including two wins over UNCW ... W&M is now 2-2 when the Tribe takes on the Seahawks in its first CAA game of the season.

Transferring Talent

W&M has two Division I transfers on its roster this season in senior forward **Hawley Smith** (Temple) and junior guard **Adam Payton** (Vanderbilt) ... Smith started nearly every game last season, but has seen limited action this year due to an ankle injury suffered a week before the season-opener ... Payton sat out last season, per NCAA transfer rules, but has started every game this year ... He scored a career-high 20 points 7-for-9 shooting at Virginia Tech (12/27) ... He also scored 19 points at Longwood (11/28) and had 18 points and seven rebounds in W&M's win at Hampton (11/22) ... The Tribe has had at least one transfer on its active roster every year but one since 1995-96 ... Each of the seven transfers since then were significant contributors with starting experience.

W&M Signs Four Early

W&M head coach Tony Shaver and his staff completed their recruiting for next season's class with the signing of four individuals on the first day of the early signing period (Nov. 9). The four future Tribe players are 6-10 forward **Steven Hess**, 6-2 guard **Matt McFadden**, 6-3 guard **David Schneider** and 6-7 forward **Danny Sumner**.

Steven Hess, 6-10, F, Gastonia, NC (Gaston Day School)

Hess averaged 16 points and nine rebounds for Gaston Day School last season, helping his team reach the semifinals of the state tournament in North Carolina's largest independent-school classification. He is a McDonald's All-American nominee and was an All-Southern Piedmont Athletic Association selection.

Matt McFadden, 6-2, G, Medford, NJ (Shawnee High School)

McFadden averaged 13 points, five assists, four rebounds and 2.5 steals per game last season at Shawnee High School. A three-time team captain, he was an All-Olympic Conference selection last year, helping his team to a 25-2 record, as Shawnee HS won the South Jersey Group 4 championship and advanced to the semifinals of the state tournament.

David Schneider, 6-3, G, Phoenix, AZ (Brophy Prep)

Schneider averaged 18.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 6.1 assists per game last season at Brophy Prep and was a first team all-region and honorable mention all-state selection. His father, Jeff, played basketball at Virginia Tech, ending his college career in 1982 with 276 assists, ninth-most in school history, before being selected in the fifth round of the 1982 NBA Draft by the Houston Rockets.

Danny Sumner, 6-7, F, Fairfax, VA (Paul VI)

Sumner averaged 14 points and 10 rebounds a game for Paul VI High School last season, as his team reached the Virginia Independent Schools Division I state final for the second straight year. Sumner was named to the 2005 Virginia Independent All-Tournament team and was an honorable mention Washington Post All-Metropolitan selection. He will be the Tribe's first men's basketball player from Paul VI since **David Cully**, who graduated from W&M in 1996 as the College's all-time blocked shots leader (248) and fifth-leading rebounder (783).

Three players made more than 75 percent of their shots from the line, led by **Corey Cofield**, who was fourth in the CAA with a .804 FT%, leading the league in free throws made (144) and attempted (179) ... **Laimis Kisielius** (.767) and **Hawley Smith** (.752) each also made over 75 percent of their foul shots ... As a team, W&M was at least .750 from the line 11 times, including three games over 90 percent.

Facility Upgrades

During the summer, W&M Hall underwent a major renovation project with the installation of a new hardwood floor ... The \$750,000 project included a wall-to-wall, 16,900 square foot permanent wood floor, large enough for two full basketball courts when the arena's bleachers are retracted ... The floor was manufactured by Connor Sports Flooring Corporation and was installed by Recreation Plus of Hopewell, Virginia.

Back-to-Back Games

This is the third straight season and the fourth time in the last five years that the Tribe has opened the season with games on consecutive days ... Last season, W&M started the season by hosting the first Tip-Off Classic, winning both games ... Before that, the last time that the College opened the season with back-to-back home games was the 1956-57 campaign, when the Tribe defeated The Citadel (87-74) on Nov. 30 and Hampden-Sydney (98-81) on Dec. 1.

Shaver Named to Episcopal HS Hall of Fame

Head coach **Tony Shaver** was inducted into the Episcopal High School (Alexandria, VA) Hall of Fame on Nov. 11 ... Shaver coached at the school for 10 seasons (1977-86), winning 73 percent of his games and two IAC championships ... After the 1986 season he was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year and his team was ranked first in Northern Virginia by the *Alexandria Gazette*.

Exhibition Game Recap

W&M defeated the University of Saskatchewan, 96-60, in an exhibition game between the two teams on Nov. 1 ... The game was tied at 10 with 13:10 to play in the first half, but W&M went on a 14-4 run and never looked back, leading 49-27 at the half and going up by as many as 40 points in the second half ... Five Tribe players scored in double figures, led by **Corey Cofield** with 16 and **Calvin Baker** with 15, along with a game-high seven assists ... Cofield and **Hawley Smith** tied for the team lead with eight rebounds ... Saskatchewan also lost at Old Dominion, 82-58, and at Virginia Tech, 90-42, as the team played its first games against NCAA Division I opponents since 1965.

Head Coach Tony Shaver

William and Mary head coach Tony Shaver is in his third season at the helm of the Tribe men's basketball program. Officially hired on May 2, 2003, Shaver is the 31st men's basketball coach in the history of the College.

"Bringing a coach and person the caliber of a Tony Shaver into the William and Mary program certainly makes this an exciting day for the College," said director of athletics Terry Driscoll at the time of the hire. "His resume speaks for itself in terms of his coaching abilities, but beyond that, I believe that he possesses all the intangible qualities that will make him a perfect fit for our school and program."

The Green and Gold continued to make strides in Shaver's second season leading the Tribe. W&M immediately started the season on a high note, defeating Radford and Hartford to win the inaugural W&M Tip-Off Classic, the first regular season tournament title for the College since 1981. The Tribe defeated James Madison in the first round of the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for W&M's first postseason win since 1997, and just the third in the last 20 years.

Shaver began his Tribe career with a 91-64 pounding of Liberty on Nov. 23, 2003. He also won his first ever Colonial Athletic Association contest, as the Tribe knocked off two-time defending league champion UNC Wilmington, 67-66, in overtime on Dec. 4, 2003. In his first contest against a nationally ranked opponent, W&M also performed well, leading No. 15 Pittsburgh by 10 points midway through the first half, before the Panthers, who attempted 28 more free throws than the Tribe, won 70-55.

There have been individual successes as well for the Green and Gold under Shaver's reign. 2004 graduate Adam Hess, currently playing professionally in Europe, became the first player in school history to lead the CAA in scoring. An outstanding student and athlete, Hess was named the CAA Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year (for all sports) and was a first team Academic All-America and all-conference selection as a senior. Current junior Corey Cofield was voted the 2004 CAA Rookie of the Year, leading all freshmen in the league in points, rebounds and field goal percentage. Cofield earned his second straight selection to the All-CAA third team in 2005, while current sophomore Laimis Kisielius earned a spot on the CAA All-Rookie team last season.

Shaver came to W&M after coaching 17 seasons at Hampden-Sydney, compiling a record of 358-121 (.747). He turned the Tigers into a Division III national powerhouse, leading the men's basketball team to eight Old Dominion Athletic Conference titles, 12 20-win seasons and 11 NCAA Division III Tournament appearances. The winningest basketball coach in the program's history, he was named the ODAC and South Region Coach of the Year in 1995, 1999 and 2000, and was picked as the Virginia Sports Information Directors Division II-III Coach of the Year in 1997, 1999 and 2000.

In 2003, Shaver took the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Final Four, as his team finished with a record of 28-4, tied for the second-most wins in the program's history. In 1999, Shaver led H-SC to the national championship game, where the Ti-

gers lost by one point in double-overtime to Wisconsin-Platteville. The team finished 29-3, setting a school record for most wins in a season.

Shaver also has a firm commitment to his players' success in the classroom. In 1999, one of his charges, Jack Jirak, was named the ODAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was also awarded the Gammon Cup as the top-student-athlete at the college. Two of Shaver's players, David Hobbs (1999) and Russell Turner (1992) earned Academic All-America honors. A number of his players have been named to the Academic All-ODAC squad, including six student-athletes in 1998.

Shaver first led the Tigers to the national postseason in 1988-89, just his third season as the team's head coach. That year, H-SC won the ODAC championship, ending the season with a 21-8 record.

Prior to taking over at Hampden-Sydney for the 1986-87 campaign, Shaver spent 10 years as the head boys' basketball coach at Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia. He was named the Virginia State Private School Coach of the Year in 1986, and was twice picked as the Alexandria Coach of the Year, while winning 73 percent of his games.

A 1976 graduate of North Carolina, Shaver was a guard on the Tar Heel men's basketball

team from 1972-75 under head coach Dean Smith. Originally a walk-on, he earned a scholarship his rookie season, when he was awarded the prestigious Butch Bennett Award, presented to the team's most outstanding freshman.

A native of High Point, North Carolina, Shaver and his wife, Ann, are the parents of three sons: Christopher (24), a former standout pitcher on the Tribe's baseball team, who is currently pitching with the Chicago Cubs organization, Austin (21) and Jackson (14).
