W&M Field Hockey Hosts North Carolina Saturday

The William and Mary field hockey team will host North Carolina Saturday, Sept. 3 at 1:00 PM on Busch Field ... The Tribe enters the game with a record of 1-1, while the Tar Heels come in with a 2-0 record this season.

About the Tribe

W&M split a pair of games last weekend, defeating Ball State, 4-1, in the home opener, before losing to Penn State, 1-0, in a double-overtime game that was decided by penalty strokes ... Tribe sophomore midfielder **Jessica Kacerek** leads the team in scoring with four points on a goal and two assists ... Three Tribe players scored their first career goal against BSU, including Kacerek, junior **JJ Kubicek** and sophomore **Laura Kastelic** ... W&M outshot Ball State, 23-2, the fewest shots allowed by the W&M defense since Sept. 26, 2003, when Radford also took just two shots ... The game against Penn State was the Tribe's first to be decided by penalty strokes in almost exactly two years, when W&M lost to Louisville, 2-1, on Aug. 31, 2003 ... Sophomore goalkeeper **Gwen Hunter** made a career high 11 saves in the game, the most for a Tribe netminder since Nov. 16, 2002, when **Claire Miller** also had 11 in an overtime loss to Maryland in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Seven Straight Winning Seasons

Head coach **Peel Hawthorne** has led the Tribe to a winning record in each of the last seven seasons, every year starting with 1998 ... A winning record this year would tie the school record of eight consecutive winning seasons, set from 1986 through 1993 ... Since the beginning of the 1998 campaign, W&M has a record of 85-55 (.607) overall and is 31-9 (.775) in CAA regular season play ... The Tribe has won at least 65 percent of its games in three of the last four seasons.

Anna Davis Closing in on Record

With a defensive save against Penn State senior defender **Anna Davis** moved into a tie for second place at W&M with 14 career defensive saves ... A first team All-CAA selection last year, she is tied with **Kim Stewart** (1981-84), but still 20 short of the school record of 34, set by **Amy Giello** (1993-96) ... Last season, Davis had seven defensive saves, tied with **Linda Schneider** (1992) for the seventh most in a single season ... The school record for defensive saves in one season is 13, set by Giello as a rookie in 1993.

Different Faces Providing Offense in 2005

Already this year, four different players have scored goals for the Tribe, including three who hadn't scored a goal before this season ... Junior **JJ Kubicek** and sophomores **Jessica Kacerek** and **Laura Kastelic** scored their first career goals in the season opener against Ball State ... Junior **Gina Cimarelli** also scored in that game, giving her nine goals in her career ... Three players have assists in 2005, with two of them, junior **Maggie Long** and freshman **Heather Winn**, earning their first career assists this season ... The Tribe has been known for its balanced scoring attack over the years, with at least 12 different players scoring a point in each of the last four seasons, including 14 in 2004.

About North Carolina

North Carolina comes into Saturday's game with a 2-0 record this season, after a pair of victories over Big Ten opponents ... The Tar Heels shut out both Michigan (2-0) and Iowa (1-0) last weekend at Iowa ... Sophomore Alli Tanner scored both goals against Michigan, with junior Rachel Dawson scoring against Iowa ... Senior

goalkeeper Katy Tran was named the ACC Player of the Week after totaling 10 saves in the two shutouts ... UNC went 21-2 last season, losing in the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... The Tar Heels ended the season ranked second in the national coaches poll.

The North Carolina Series

UNC leads the series with W&M, 20-3-2, and has won 19 straight games against the Tribe ... W&M's last win over the Tar Heels was a 4-0 decision in Williamsburg on Oct. 10, 1980 ... The two teams have played each other every year since 1999 ... Since the series began with a 2-1 W&M win in Farmville, Virginia on Sept. 30, 1978, the two schools have played each other once a season every year except 1996 and 1998 ... Last season, UNC defeated W&M, 3-0, in Chapel Hill on Sept. 26

Strong Play in the CAA

Including last season's regular season title with a perfect 7-0 record against the CAA, the Tribe has finished in third place or bet-

ter in the league in each of the last seven seasons ... The CAA has finished third in the nation in the NCAA RPI report the last three years ... W&M enters this season on a 13-game winning streak against league opponents in the regular season, a run that began on Oct. 3, 2003 with a 2-1 win over Drexel ... W&M hasn't lost a home game to a conference opponent in the regular season since falling to then No. 2 Old Dominion on Sept. 22, 2002.

Season Openers

With this year's 4-1 win over Ball State, W&M has won its last three season-opening games, defeating Vermont (6-0) on Aug. 30, 2003 and winning at Ohio (3-1) on Aug. 28 last season ... The Green and Gold is 24-6-3 (.773) in the first game of the season since 1973.

Home Openers

The Tribe has now won eight straight home openers, including this year's win over Ball State ... The last time W&M lost its first home game of the year was Sept.

12, 1997 with a 3-0 loss to Northeastern ... The last time before this season that the College opened the season at home was 2003 with a 6-0 win over Vermont on Aug. 30 ... This was just the third time that the Tribe has opened at home since 1997.

Kelly Giles Attempts to Repeat as CAA Player of the Year

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was voted the CAA Player of the Year last season, the first player in school history to earn that honor ... This season she will attempt to become just the third player in league history to earn the honor more than once ... The only other players to have repeated as CAA Player of the Year are James Madison's Carole Thate (1993, 1994, 1995) and Old Dominion's Marina DiGiacomo (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000).

Giles Earns All-America Honors in 2004

Senior forward **Kelly Giles** was named to the womensfieldhockey.com All-America second team and was a third team National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-American last season ... W&M has had four All-Americans in the last three years, including **Ann Ekberg** (2002), **Claire Miller** (2002) and **Kelli Duggan** (2003).

Kelly Giles Climbing the Charts

With seven career game-winning goals, senior forward **Kelly Giles** is sixth in school history ... The 2004 CAA Player of the Year led the conference with five last season, tied with five others, including current assistant coach **Kelly McQuade**, for third in W&M history ... Giles needs one more to tie **Joanie Quinn** (1987-90) for fifth all-time and is four away from tying **Lydia Donley** (1988-91) for fourth place.

Defenders Starting to Reach Top 10

Senior defenders **Anna Davis** and **Shannon Karl** are both likely to break into the Tribe's top 10 games started list this season ... After coming off the bench for the

first two Tribe games of her career, Karl has started the last 59 W&M games and is just one away from tying five others for 10th place in school history with 60 career starts ... Davis has started every game the last two seasons and now has 55 career starts ... Also likely to crack the top 10 this season is senior defender **Diana Esposito** who has 51 starts, including every game since 2003 ... The W&M record for career starts is 80, held by another defender, **Amy Giello** (1993-96).

Tribe Picked Second in CAA

W&M was picked to finish second in the CAA, in the preseason coaches poll released by the conference in early August ... The Tribe received three of the nine first-place votes, one less than Old Dominion which finished first in the poll ... W&M finished first in the league last season, with a 7-0 regular-season record against CAA opponents.

2005 Tribe Player Profiles

Head Coach Peel Hawthorne

Now in her 19th season at W&M, Peel Hawthorne is the winningest field hockey coach in school history with a record of 213-146-2 (.593) at the College. Including four seasons as head coach at Division III Connecticut College, Hawthorne is 244-163-5 (.598) in her coaching career.

Last season she earned her third CAA Coach of the Year honor, after leading the Tribe to a 7-0 conference record and the regular season CAA title. The best conference record in school history, it is also the first time that W&M has ever won a regular season conference championship outright. In 2003, W&M and Old Dominion tied for first place with 6-1 conference records. Hawthorne also was named CAA Coach of the Year in 1995 and 2001.

Hawthorne has led the Tribe to its only two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002. During her career as a defender at W&M, the Tribe posted a record of 52-13-7 and made two trips to the AIAW Nationals, finishing fifth in the nation in 1979. The Green and Gold totaled 37 shutouts and allowed just 0.92 goals per game in her career.
