Anna Davis Named CAA Defensive Player of the Year

W&M senior **Anna Davis** was voted by the league's head coaches as the 2005 CAA Defensive Player of the Year, the first player in Tribe history to earn that honor ... Davis has 10 defensive saves this season, leading the CAA in that category for the second straight season after making seven last year ... Through Sunday, Oct. 30, she was ranked second in the nation with the 10 defensive saves ... That day she made four saves, all in the first half, against Old Dominion ... Davis is second in W&M history with 23 defensive saves in her career ... This is the second straight season that she has been voted to the all-conference first team, after earning second team honors as a sophomore in 2003.

Three Players Earn CAA Honors

Led by CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first team all-league pick **Anna Davis**, three W&M players were voted to all-conference accolades ... Senior defender **Diana Esposito** was picked to the second team ... Freshman midfielder **Heather Winn** was named to the all-rookie team.

Two Tribe Players Selected to NFHCA North-South Senior All-Star Game

Defender **Anna Davis** and midfielder **Shannon Karl** have been selected to compete in the 2005 NFHCA North-South Senior All-Star Game ... It is the fourth time in the last five seasons that W&M has had the maximum of two players picked to play in the game ... Last season **Kate Baird** and **Ginny Sutton** represented the Green and Gold at the event ... This year's game will be hosted by the University of Louisville on Saturday, November 19 at 7:30 PM.

Head Coach Peel Hawthorne Earns 250th Career Victory

With W&M's 2-1 win over Delaware, head coach **Peel Hawthorne** earned the 250th coaching victory of her career ... A 1980 graduate of W&M, Hawthorne has a career coaching record of 252-172-5, including the last 19 seasons as head coach of the Tribe and four years (1983-86) as the head coach at Connecticut College ... She is the far and away the winningest field hockey coach in school history with 221 wins at the College ... Entering this season, just 30 coaches in the history of college field hockey (all levels) had amassed at least 250 career wins.

Balanced Scoring Again for W&M

One of the hallmarks of the Tribe over the last few seasons has been its balanced scoring attack ... This season, 17 of the 19 field players have at least one point, including 15 different goal scorers ... W&M has had at least 12 different players score

Tribe Looking for Third CAA Title This Year and 84th in W&M History

This weekend the Tribe will attempt to win its third CAA title of the fall ... Already this season, the College's men's and women's cross country teams have won conference titles, the only two to be awarded by the league prior to this weekend ... The Tribe has won 83 CAA titles since the league began in the 1983-84 season, 32 more than the next closest school (James Madison, 51) ... W&M has won 23.3 percent of the CAA titles awarded in all sports ... Even if none of W&M's men's titles were counted, the Green and Gold would still lead the league in championships won, as W&M has taken 55 of the 168 (32.7 percent) women's titles ... The Tribe has won or shared 140 conference titles in school history, including 48 Southern Conference championships, six ECAC Gymnastics titles and three Atlantic 10 Football Conference crowns.

Tribe Picked Second in CAA

W&M was picked to finish second in the CAA in the preseason coaches poll released by the conference in early August ... The Tribe received three of the nine first-place votes, one less than Old Dominion which finished first in the poll ... W&M finished first in the league last season, with a 7-0 regular-season record against CAA opponents.

2005 Tribe Player Profiles

Head Coach Peel Hawthorne

Now in her 19th season at W&M, Peel Hawthorne is the winningest field hockey coach in school history with a record of 221-155-2 (.587) at the College. Including four seasons as head coach at Division III Connecticut College, Hawthorne is 252-172-5 (.593) in her coaching career.

Last season she earned her third CAA Coach of the Year honor, after leading the Tribe to a 7-0 conference record and the regular season CAA title. The best conference record in school history, it is also the first time that W&M has ever won a regular season conference championship outright. In 2003, W&M and Old Dominion tied for first place with 6-1 conference records. Hawthorne also was named CAA Coach of the Year in 1995 and 2001.

Hawthorne has led the Tribe to its only two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002. During her career as a defender at W&M, the Tribe posted a record of 52-13-7 and made two trips to the AIAW Nationals, finishing fifth in the nation in 1979. The Green and Gold totaled 37 shutouts and allowed just 0.92 goals per game in her career.
