GREEN AND GOLD SET FOR CAA TOURNAMENT

The William and Mary field hockey team returns to the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament after a one-year hiatus to battle No. 5 seed Hofstra on Thursday, Nov. 6, at 6 p.m. The CAA Tournament will be held at the United States National Training Center in Virginia Beach, Va., Nov. 6-9. The Tribe is the No. 4 seed in the event after finishing the regular season at 4-4 in league play.

W&M is 9-2 all-time in first round games at the CAA Tournament and is 11-16 overall at the event. The Tribe is tournament's No. 4 seed for the fifth time and owns a 3-4 record all-time as the No. 4 seed.

The winner of the Hofstra-W&M tilt will face CAA regular season champion and No. 4-ranked James Madison on Saturday, Nov. 8 at noon in the first CAA semifinal. The CAA Championship match is slated for 1 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 9. The winner of the CAA crown will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Tickets for each day of the CAA Tournament are \$5 for adults and \$3 for children 12 and under. Students with a valid ID will be admitted free.

TRIBE NEWS AND NOTES

- The Tribe faced a difficult schedule in 2008 that included six top-20 opponents and another seven foes who were receiving votes for the top 20.

- W&M is ranked No. 36 in the latest NCAA RPI released on Nov. 3. The Tribe is the fourth ranked CAA team behind No. 4 James Madison, No. 15 Drexel and No. 19 Old Dominion.

- The Green and Gold defense has shutout three of its last five opponents.

- Senior Katie Broaddus and junior Wesley Drew were named the Tribe's co-captains for the 2008 season.

- W&M recorded its first win over a nationally ranked opponent since the 2006 season with its 1-0 win over then-No. 19 Rutgers on Oct. 19.

- The Tribe scored its most goals in a CAA contest since 2002 when it tallied six in an overtime victory at Hofstra on Oct. 12.

- As a team, W&M ranks third in the CAA with seven defensive saves. Sophomore Courtney Farino ranks third in the league with three defensive saves followed by senior Katie Broaddus in sixth with two and sophomore Erica Eng and junior Wesley Drew in ninth with one each.

- Four different Tribe players scored a goal in W&M's 4-0 win at Longwood on Oct. 31. Junior Wesley Drew and sophomore Rebecca Wagner each had a goal and an assist in the victory, while junior Kelsey Jackson and senior Katie Broaddus each added tallies as well.

- Sophomore Jenna Cinalli scored her team-leading seventh goal of the season at Old Dominion on Nov. 2.

- W&M continues to have a young roster as evident by 17 out of 24 players owning freshman or sophomore athletic eligibility.

- Ten different W&M players have scored a goal for the College this season, while 11 players have at least registered a point on the year.

SCOUTING HOFSTRA

The Pride qualified for the CAA Tournament as the No. 5 seed. Hofstra finished with an identical CAA record (4-4) as the Tribe, but as a result of W&M's 6-5 overtime win over the Pride this season, Hofstra received the No. 5 seed. The Pride enters the tournament on a three-match winning streak and finished the regular season with a 10-8 overall record. In its recent three-match streak, the Pride defeated Northeastern (2-1), Towson (3-2 in OT) and Delaware (3-1).

Hofstra is led offensively by Charlia Warner, who finished with 26 points on 11 goals, including three game-winners, and four assists. She ranks sixth in the CAA in goals scored and ninth in points. Kristin Thompson, who had a big game against the Tribe with two goals and an assist, ranks second

on the Pride in scoring with 25 points on seven goals and 11 assists. Her assist total ranks fourth in the league. Brit Blankmeyer also has over 20 points this season for the Pride with 21 on eight goals and five assists. Blankmeyer, like Thompson, also had two goals in the loss to W&M earlier this season. Hofstra finished the year ranked fourth in the CAA in scoring, but also ranked seventh in goals allowed.

Krishna Giammarco and Amanda Heyde have both seen significant time in goal for the Pride, though Heyde has started each of Hofstra's last three victories. Heyde has started 10 matches, including the contest against W&M, and owns a GAA of 2.67 to go along with 66 saves and a shutout. Giammarco has started seven matches and has a 2.71 GAA and 19 saves.

The Tribe is 5-3 all-time against the Pride, but Hofstra holds a victory in the lone CAA Tournament game, 1-0, in overtime during the 2004 season. The 2004 CAA Championship was hosted by W&M at Busch Turf Field.

RECAPPING THE REGULAR SEASON HOFSTRA-W&M SHOOTOUT

The last meeting between W&M and Hofstra was a shootout as evident by the Tribe tallying a 6-5 overtime win at the Pride on Oct. 12. After W&M junior Kelsey Jackson sent the game to overtime with a goal late in the second half, freshman Leah Zamesnik punched across the game-winner four minutes into the extra session to give W&M the win.

The six goals were the most for the Tribe since it scored seven against Kent State in 2005. It was the highest scoring output for the Green and Gold in a CAA contest since 2002. Redshirt freshman Mikala Savaides led the W&M charge with two goals, while Zamesnik, Jackson, sophomore Rebecca Wagner and redshirt freshman Kelsey Nawalinski each added a tally.

After Hofstra's Kristin Thompson scored back-to-back goals in the 49th and 52nd minutes to give Hofstra a 5-4 lead, the Tribe rallied to even the game and send it to extra time. Jackson scored with a point blank shot to knot the game, 5-5, at the 64:16 mark as Cinalli found her with a pass. The goal was Jackson's first of the season. The College claimed the win as Zamesnik sent a low shot past Pride goalkeeper Amanda Heyde from just in front of the cage off a centering pass from Jackson. The marker just 3:52 into the seven-on-seven overtime period was the Tribe rookie's first career game-winner.

Hofstra held a 28-11 advantage in shots and a 9-2 cushion in penalty corners. Sophomore goalkeeper Carrie Thompson made eight saves in goal for W&M.

W&M jumped out to an early advantage to go up 2-0 with a pair of goals in the opening 21 minutes of the contest. Savaides gave the College the quick lead with a goal only 40 seconds into the match. The redshirt freshman forward followed up her own rebound off a save from Heyde. Fellow classmate Kelsey Nawalinski extended the W&M lead in the 21st minute.

Hofstra answered with a pair of goals before the half, tying the game at two at the intermission. Charlia Warner scored on a low shot under the leg pad of Thompson in the 25th minute. Brit Blankmeyer tied it just 22 seconds before the half, converting a penalty corner pass from Kristin Thompson.

Blankmeyer capped a three-straight goal barrage by the Pride, scoring 1:37 into the second half. Jenna Kovar played give-and-go with Blankmeyer as Hofstra used a counter to take it first lead of the game at 3-2. Savaides wasted little time answering back as she knotted the contest a mere 56 seconds later. The Burke, Va., native slotted home a shot in traffic from in front of the cage. The College retook the lead, 4-3, on Wagner's hard shot from the left side of the circle at the 41:41 mark.

SAVAIDES, NAWALINSKI RAKE IN ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONORS

On three occasions this season, a W&M freshman was named the CAA Rookie of the Week. Redshirt Freshman Mikala Savaides nabbed the distinction for the second time this year on Oct. 13. Fellow classmate Kelsey Nawalinski received the rookie of the week honor on Oct. 6, while Savaides garnered her first accolade on Sept. 22. Savaides received the latest recognition after scoring a pair of goals in the Tribe's 6-5 overtime win over Hofstra.

Savaides opened the scoring against the Pride with a goal 40 seconds in to the contest. After Hofstra scored three-straight goals to take a 3-2 lead less than two minutes into the second half, Savaides quickly answered for the College to even things at three. Just 56 seconds after Hofstra had taken the lead, the redshirt freshman forward scored in traffic for her second tally of the game. Savaides won her first honor after scoring her first collegiate goal in the Tribe's overtime loss to Richmond. She ranks third on the team in goals scored with four.

Nawalinski earned the honor on Oct. 6 after tallying her first career points. She finished the week with two goals, including the overtime game-winner against Towson on Oct. 5, and an assist. In the Tribe's heartbreaking 3-2 penalty stroke setback to Delaware, Nawalinski factored into both Green and Gold goals. She tallied her first collegiate assist, finding sophomore Jenna Cinalli in the crease to give W&M a 1-0

lead in the 16th minute, before increasing the Tribe cushion to 2-0 with her first collegiate goal five minutes later off a penalty corner pass from senior Katie Broaddus. With the College playing its fifth straight overtime affair at home against Towson, Nawalinski crashed the weak side and punched in a centering pass from sophomore Rebecca Wagner just 24 seconds in the overtime period, giving W&M the victory.

Savaides and Nawalinski are the third and fourth Tribe players to earn CAA Rookie of the Week honors. They join fellow teammate Rebecca Wagner in receiving the distinction over the last two years. Wagner won award at the beginning of 2007 season. The only other W&M player to win CAA Rookie of the Week honors was Shannon Karl in 2002.

GOING THE DISTANCE AND MORE

During the 2008 season, the Tribe played six overtime contests, including one match that was decided in a stroke off. The six overtime affairs rank as the second most in school history behind the seven extra time contests played during the 1983 campaign. W&M is 3-3 this season in overtime tilts.

W&M played three straight overtime games against Penn (Sept. 13), St. Joseph's (Sept. 14) and Richmond (Sept. 21). It marked the second time in school history W&M played three consecutive overtime contests. The Tribe also accomplished the feat in 2002.

The College played back-to-back home overtime contests against Delaware (Oct. 3) and Towson (Oct. 5). The Fighting Blue Hens claimed the first of those games in a stroke-off, 3-2, while the Tribe rebounded to down Towson, 2-1, in extra time. W&M also won its most recent overtime affair at Hofstra, 6-5, on Oct. 12. In total, W&M has played a total of 52:20 of extra time this season.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

As the season has worn on, the Tribe's offensive production has increased dramatically. The Green and Gold struggled out of the gates offensively only scoring one goal in the opening four games of the season, but over the last 15 contests, W&M is averaging 2.26 goals per game and has not been shutout.

Over the last 15 games, the Tribe has scored 34 goals and tallied 93 points. The College is average 2.26 goals per game and 6.2 points per contest. On the season, the Tribe is average just over 10 shots and over six shots on goal per game. Over the last 15 games, those numbers have been increasingly better. During the stretch, the Tribe has attempted 11.3 shots per game with nearly eight attempts going on frame.

THE DISH

Junior Wesley Drew has been a focal point of the W&M offense this season, despite the fact that she moved from the midfield to a center back position to help solidify the Green and Gold defense earlier in the season. This season, Drew became the first Tribe player in eight years to tally eight assists. Her total ranks as the sixth-best single season total in W&M history. She also currently ranks ninth in the CAA in assists this season. Two of her helpers have been of the game-winning variety. Drew is tied for the team lead in points with 16, while adding a quartet of goals this season.

KNOCKING OFF THE NATIONALLY RANKED

W&M recorded its first victory over a nationally ranked foe since the 2006 season when it upset then-No. 19 Rutgers, 1-0, on Oct. 19. After a scoreless first half, the Green and Gold broke through early in the second stanza. Off a Rutgers turnover, redshirt freshman Kelsey Nawalinski stepped into the circle on the left side and sent a hard ball to the center of the crease, where senior Lauren Giles redirected the ball over top of the RU goalkeeper for what proved to be the game-winner. The Tribe defense made it stand as sophomore goalkeeper Carrie Thompson made six saves in registering her first career shutout. Sophomore defender Erica Eng came up with her first collegiate defensive save as well in the second half to keep the Scarlet Knights off the board. The win over a nationally ranked foe was the first for W&M since the 2006 season when W&M defeated No. 18 Hofstra, 1-0, in Williamsburg on Oct. 20.

COLLEGIATE FIRSTS

This season, a total of five W&M players have recorded their first collegiate points. The list includes sophomores Erica Eng and Maura Checchio, redshirt freshmen Kelsey Nawalinski and Mikala Savaides and true freshman Leah Zamesnik. Four different Tribe players have recorded their first collegiate goals for the Green and Gold this season, while six have recorded their first collegiate assists.
