Tribe Sends Two Individuals to NCAA Women's Tennis Tournament

William and Mary's women's tennis team will be represented by two players at the 2004 NCAA Women's Tennis Individual Tournament in Athens, Georgia ... Sophomore **Megan Muth (Covington, LA)**, ranked 25th in the nation with a record of 27-14, will compete for the national singles championship ... She and junior **Amy Wei (Marietta, GA)** will also compete in the doubles bracket ... They are ranked 26th in the nation with a record of 29-10 ... This will be the third straight season, and the seventh time in the last eight years, that the Tribe has sent at least one singles player and a doubles team to the NCAA Individual Tournament.

About the Tribe

The W&M team ended the 2004 season in the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a record of 20-13 ... Ranked 36th in the nation, the Tribe upset No. 22 Illinois, 4-2, in the first round, before falling to host Duke, ranked fourth in the country ... W&M currently has two singles players and one doubles team in the national rankings ... **Megan Muth** is 25th in the country in singles, while junior **Lena Sherbakov** is ranked 114th ... Muth and **Amy Wei** are ranked 26th in the nation in doubles ... Earlier this season, the Tribe won its 17th Colonial Athletic Association title in 20 tries ... W&M finished second in the CAA the three times that it did not win the conference championship ... This marked the Tribe's 13th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and its ninth in the last 10 seasons ... Last year, the Tribe reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, defeating Temple and South Alabama in Williamsburg, before eventually falling to Duke.

Head Coach Kevin Epley

Tribe head coach Kevin Epley is in his first season at W&M, after spending the last three years leading the Fresno State women's team ... This season he was voted as the CAA Coach of the Year, his third consecutive conference coach of the year honor, after earning the award from the Western Athletic Conference in 2002 and 2003 ... This is also his third consecutive season coaching a team to a league title, as he led the Bulldogs to the WAC Championship in 2002 and 2003 ... He led his Fresno State teams to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of his three seasons ... Epley was the No. 1 player on the men's team at Southern Methodist and was named to the All-Southwest Conference First Team in 1995.

Tribe Extends CAA Dynasty

W&M has dominated the Colonial Athletic Association in women's tennis like few other teams in any sport or conference ... The Green and Gold have won 17 of the 20 CAA titles in women's tennis, finishing second the other three seasons ... Including regular season and tournament matches, W&M has a record of 98-3 (.970) against CAA teams, with two losses coming in the league title match ... No school has won more than 13 CAA titles in any other sport.

Awards Continue for Megan Muth

Tribe sophomore and No. 1 player **Megan Muth** has been well-recognized for her outstanding play this season ... At the conclusion of the regular season, she was voted as the 2004 Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Year (along with Old Dominion's Nataly Cahana) ... In the conference tournament, she went 2-0 at No. 1 singles and 2-1 at No. 1 doubles, and was voted as the outstanding player of the tournament ... Last week, it was announced that she had been voted as the ITA East Region Player to Watch by the regional committee ... That honor puts her in contention for the national award, which will be announced on May 23 ... A first team All-CAA selection in both singles and doubles each of her first two seasons, Muth was named as the league's singles player of the week on March 9 and April 13, and, with partner **Amy Wei**, was picked as the conference's doubles team of the week on March 9, April 6 and April 20 ... Last season, Muth was voted as the CAA and ITA East Region Rookie of the Year.

Wei Earns First Team All-CAA Honors

This season, junior **Amy Wei** earned first team All-CAA honors in singles and doubles for the second straight season ... She also earned second team all-conference honors in doubles as a freshman ... The Tribe's captain this year, she was named as the league's singles player of the week on April 20, and was selected with Muth as the doubles team of the week on March 9, April 6 and April 20.

Muth and Wei Win ITA East Regional Junior **Amy Wei** and sophomore **Megan Muth** teamed up to win the ITA East Region doubles championship on their way to a 10-1 record in the fall ... It was the second straight year for Muth to win a regional title, as she won the singles championship as a freshman in 2002.

Muth Piles up Big Wins

Megan Muth has posted 12 wins this season against nationally-ranked singles opponents ... That total does not include a victory this spring against 2003 NCAA Singles Champion Amber Liu (Stanford), who is currently seventh in the nation, but was not ranked early in the spring, due to a lack of fall results.

Tough Competition

As always, the Tribe was tested with one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation this season ... 20 of W&M's 25 non-CAA matches in the regular season were against nationally-ranked teams ... The College faced 11 teams currently ranked in the top 25 and played

14 matches against 2004 NCAA Tournament teams in the regular season.
