My Dear Cal.

Haylewood introduced
in the House, early part of the session
the proper Resolution on proceeding for
the retirement of Judge Moncure. I
do not know whether the precaution
was taken, to secure a copy in the
Judge. This should be seen to: and
there is no time to lose.

At some time or other the Resolution was
placed in Frazer's hands, returning
Judge Anderson. He has never
presented it. I urged him to place
it in some one else's hands, if he
was restrained by a sense of
dificulty. He promised me before

I hope Mr. Belmont that he would
place the Resolution in some one
else's hands for attention - It has not
been done. He has forgotten it.

Now this proceeding - the re-
moval of Mr. Cass and Anderson
became a matter of the great im-
portance - Since we have passed
the Bill going for the life of the
Copper & funding Bill of 1871.

A case is likely to be made
up at any moment, trying the
Constitutionality - of these measures

and our whole Scheme for obtaining
the help of cutting ^{copies} is exposed to defeat.

If we will proceed now to substitute
two our people for Minors &
Anderson, then our deal with
Min is remarkably safe -
for Decker is already com-
mitted by his published opinion
as the copy - Can't you take
this Anderson case & Resolution
in hand - You need only copy
or apply the one introduced
by Haylewood, if Hayler

has lost the copy placed in his
hands, Remember it requires
20-days notice -
